Expectations Reminder

Many of our students arrive in school wearing the correct uniform but unfortunately, there are some students who do not conform to the uniform regulations, particularly in relation to the style of trouser and skirt. Please ensure that students return after the half term break wearing the correct uniform:

- Plain black knee length skirt or tailored trousers for girls ('tube' skirts made from stretchy material and leggings are not permitted) and plain black trousers for boys (black jeans are not permitted for any students).
- Hooded sweatshirts are not permitted on school site and will be confiscated. Jewellery (with the exception of one pair of small plain ear studs no crystals or diamante) must not be worn. Students must wear black shoes which can be polished, no trainer type shoes, canvas, casual or sport shoe, e.g. Vans or Nike Air Force shoes. Kickers are acceptable, but stitching must be black.
- Haircuts must be appropriate, no non-natural colours and no shaved patterns, this includes eyebrows. No make-up is to be worn and false or coloured nails are not allowed. Please note that students will not be permitted to attend lessons if uniform is not correct.

Equipment

Students must bring a minimum of 5 black pens, 3 green pens, pencils, pencil sharpener, ruler, rubber, glue stick, highlighters, calculator and maths set. Equipment should be carried in a bag large enough to support an A4 ring binder without folding it. A reading book should also be brought to school every day. Equipment will be checked every morning and students who do not come with the correct equipment will be issued a same-day detention.

May I also remind parents that 4th March is no longer an INSET day and students should be in school.
